"The 1918 World Series between the Chicago Cubs and Boston Red Sox was remarkable for several reasons. Boston scored only nine runs in the entire Series, the fewest by the winning team in Series history. It is one of only three fall classics where neither team hit a home run and is the only one to be played entirely in September. Game 1 marked the first time "The Star-Spangled Banner" was performed at a major league game, and the winner of that contest was none other than Babe Ruth, who pitched a shutout. The Sox wouldn't win another title until 2004, and the Cubs are still looking for their first since 1908. Fast forward to 2018, where the two storied franchises are set to faceoff again amidst tragedy at Boston's Fenway Park, the appearance of a shadowy scorekeeper, mystical forces that challenge the new team owner and an authentic Civil War letter that accuses a commanding officer of cowardice - a powerful combo that even a non-sports fan like me found compelling."
